Babcock's domestic capability is growing in the Defence, Aviation and Critical Services sectors, while drawing on a global pedigree that has worked in partnership with customers for more than a century.

We integrate end-user focused and OEM agnostic solutions and support the complex supply chains required to deliver the best outcome for our customers' specific and evolving requirements.

Some of the ways we have demonstrated this include:

- Partnering with the Australian Defence Force (ADF) to deliver the strategic asset management of the common Ground Support Equipment (GSE) across more than 20 operating bases in Australia and internationally. The GSE fleet consists of 3,500+ assets across more than 210 types of GSE.
- > Implementing a 'first of kind' Prime Vendor model for Land 3025 Counter-Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (C-CBRNE) equipment, to deliver high levels of equipment availability.
- Acting early in the face of the global pandemic to ensure the safety of our people and the New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF). Splitting the dock workforce into alternating teams was one of the ways we drastically reduced the chances of community transmission.

Babcock's commitment to delivering Sovereign Industry Capability is embedded within current and future business thinking. Our approach provides protection and assurance for Australian suppliers and vendors and is leading the charge for other Defence Primes.


Technology agnostic approach

Babcock is a well-established supporter of veteran employment, with a workforce comprising highly qualified ex-service personnel in addition to active Defence Reservists.

We are committed to integrating veterans and Defence Reservists into our business and recognise the outstanding skills and experience they have to offer to support our business growth in Defence, Aviation and Critical Services. On our Prime Vendor contract for managing the ADF's C-CBRNE equipment alone, more than 70% of staff are veterans.

Our commitment is also realised through our support of several veterans' welfare and support organisations.
